Richard Pomfret (Ph.D) is a professor of Economics at the University of Adelaide, Australia. He has experience as a policy adviser and researcher; his interests include development economics; international economics and trade. He was Regional Adviser on macroeconomic policy to the Asian republics of the former Soviet Union for the United Nations Economic and Social Commission for Asia and the Pacific from 1992 to 1994.
